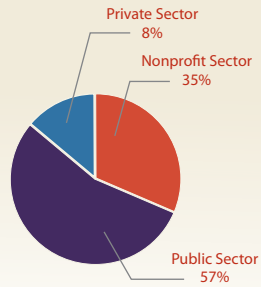

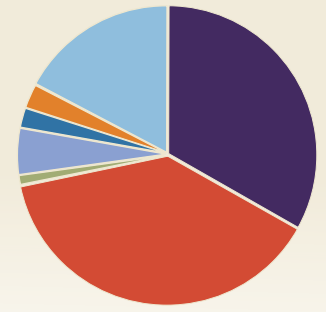
Class of 2009 graduates employed within six months of graduation: **84%**

Awards and Honors

The Evans School ranks 14th out of 269 schools of public affairs, and is 6th for schools of public affairs at public universities in the latest *US News and World Report* rankings.

US News and World Report ranks the Evans School 4th in Environmental Management and Policy, 5th in Nonprofit Management, and in the top 20 for Public-Policy Analysis and Public Management Administration among all U.S. schools of public affairs.

Ranked 3rd among all U.S. universities for faculty scholarly productivity in public policy by *The Chronicle of Higher Education*.
